



Get TCEP Tweets Pushed to Your Phone as SMS Text Messages

The only way to get TCEP notifications and incident updates pushed to your phone is through Twitter. Follow the instructions below. Once you've set these preferences, you never have to actually use Twitter for anything other than getting TCEP notifications. Think of it as another part of your emergency kit. Consider also following @LACoFD_DivVII (LA County Fire Division 7) and @LACoFDPIO (LA County Fire Public Information Officer). Once you receive a tweet about an incident, go to tcep.org/emergencystatus for more details.

1. Download the Twitter app. If you don't have a Twitter account, create one.
2. Log in to your Twitter account and search for **TCEP90290**. Once on TCEP's profile page, tap the **Follow** button.
3. Tap the **bell icon** to the left of the **Follow** button. Tap **All Tweets**.
4. Navigate back to your own profile page (tap your **profile icon** or the three lines depending on your device OS).
5. Tap **Settings and privacy** then tap **Notifications**. Under Preferences, tap **Push notifications**.
6. Tap **Tweets**.
7. Go to your phone settings and select how you want notifications from Twitter to be displayed.

The above settings will push ALL TCEP tweets to your phone. TCEP respects your privacy and limits tweets during calm conditions.
